We use advanced tools such as:

- 🕒 Digital gait analysis
- 🕒 Foam impression casting



These techniques allow us to collect precise data about your feet and how you move. Your orthotics are then custom-made at a specialized lab to match your body's specific mechanics.

Will I Feel a Difference Right Away?

Some patients feel immediate relief, while others may need a few weeks to adjust. A short break-in period is completely normal. Your provider will guide you on gradually increasing wear time for optimal comfort and effectiveness.

How Long Do Custom Orthotics Last?

Most custom orthotics last between 2 to 5 years, depending on how often they're worn and how well they're cared for. We'll check them periodically to ensure they're still meeting your needs as your posture or condition evolves.

Do Orthotics Fit in Any Type of Shoe?

Custom orthotics fit most athletic or casual shoes that have removable insoles. If you often wear dress shoes or boots, we can offer guidance on specialized orthotic options to ensure you get the right fit and function for your lifestyle.

Will My Insurance Cover Custom Orthotics?

Most extended health insurance plans do cover custom orthotics, but direct billing is often not available. We recommend contacting your provider to confirm your specific coverage details in advance.





What Should I Expect When Ordering Custom Orthotics?

To begin your custom orthotic process:

- A \$250 deposit is required at the time of your foot scan or casting.
- The remaining balance is due once your orthotics arrive.
- A follow-up fitting appointment is included at no extra cost to ensure proper fit and performance.

At your fitting appointment, you will receive:

- A detailed receipt for insurance
- Authenticity documentation from the orthotics lab
- A gait and postural analysis report (if applicable)
- Care and usage instructions to help maximize the life of your orthotics
